

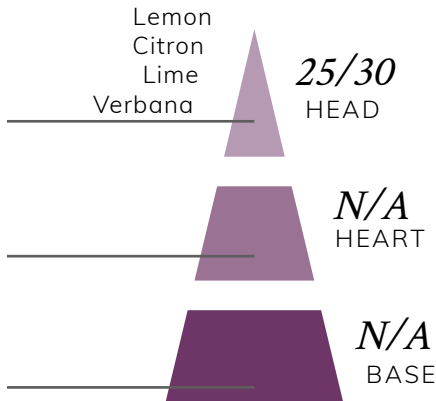
GUERLAIN - EAU DE FLEURS DE CÉDRAT - EST. 1920

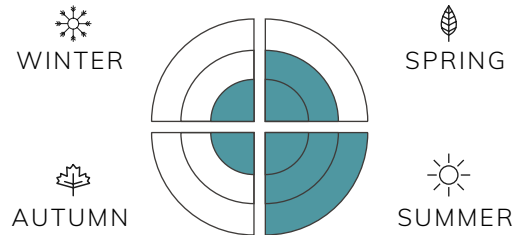
